#### Communication of communication

Just in case you've been wondering in the meantime what actually happened to the finalized Climate Protection Concept - we're in the final stages of preparing it for publication, and you'll be able to access it starting February 21.

#### Business travel expense claim form

At the beginning of the year, we have a small mini-success to report regarding the data situation in the area of business trips. The business trip expense report form has been revised so that you are now asked to accurately record your stopovers as well when submitting your report. This - promised! - mini-minimal additional effort for you greatly improves the data quality for calculating greenhouse gas emissions. This is especially relevant when evaluating air travel.

#### 52:8 for bicycles

As reported in the last newsletter, 52 new bicycle parking spaces were planned for the Haarentor site in front of building V03. This measure has now been implemented. In return, 8 parking spaces for cars could give way.

#### Sloped glazing

During the renovation of the ring level at the Wechloy site, 3 parallel rows of PV systems will also be implemented. These can generate 45 kWp of electricity and are also suitable for preventing bird strikes.
